IN MEMORIAM: Marlene Aron



Sadly, PRS member **Marlene Aron** was struck and killed by a truck last month. A fervent supporter of the arts, a prolific artist and poet, Marlene had just been working on an installation of recycled materials for the joint exhibition "Reflections" with Marilynn Pardee at the Reclaimed Room Gallery, San Francisco, CA. (The exhibition continues until November 16.) Marlene's works were in the Carnegie Museum of Art, Pittsburgh, PA; the Marin Museum of Contemporary Art; the San Francisco Mission Cultural Center; and De Galerie Den Haag in the Netherlands. Marlene was a dedicated scholar, an expert on Vincent Van Gogh, and frequently lectured on the arts and art history. See the San Francisco Chronicle obituary statement at this link.

Barbara Stevens Strauss (image left) has received training of accomplished teachers of traditional Japanese art forms, including ikebana, raku ceramics and tea ceremony and has demonstrated these forms in venues including the Oakland Asian Cultural Center and UC Botanical Garden. In September, Barbara gave a workshop "Bringing the Outside In: An Introduction to *Chabana*", which is the art of tea ceremony flowers. Participants used garden flowers and small vases to create arrangements, and enjoyed refreshments of high quality Japanese tea and specially prepared tea sweets (*wagashi*).

Teddy Milder's wall constructions series (images below) are in the exhibition *What Knot* at the Richmond Art Center, Richmond, CA through November 16. The images are of Oaxacan ancient and new walls that honor Mexican history and culture. Printed on *amate* paper made during an artist residency in 2016 (just after the US presidential election), Teddy stitched enhancements & memories into each wall image - an attempt to combat the fear generated by Trump's threat of constructing a border wall. Sponsored by Richmond Art Center and Surface Design Association, the exhibit was juried by Camille Ann Brewer, Curator of Contemporary

Art at The George Washington University Museum and The Textile Museum, D.C. Also, two of Teddy's works are included in the current <u>Surface Design Association Online Exhibition</u>.









Ruth Tabancay's works are in the exhibition *What Knot* at the Richmond Art Center, Richmond, CA, including her Jacquard weavings with hand embroidery, "Knit 322X" and "Purl 322X". Ruth also has works in the solo exhibition *Stitch* at Mercury 20 Gallery,

Oakland, CA. She used a knitting machine to created lengths of tubing for her site-specific installation, "Knit" (image below); also exhibited are "What's In and On Your Body" (an expansion of her series of embroidery set in Petri dishes, image above), "Fissility II" and related works of stitched, metallized Tyvek. The exhibition continues through October 20. Ruth also has works appearing in the exhibition *Ingenuity* at Marin Society of Artists in San Rafael, CA, juried by **Ariel Zaccheo**, Assistant Curator at San Francisco Museum of Craft & Design, and in the exhibition *Forms & Sequences* at Siskiyou Arts Museum, Dunsmuir, CA, juried by **Phil Linhares**, former Chief Curator at Oakland Museum of California.



Zahava Shavez lives and works both in Oakland CA and in Chapala, Jalisco, MX (image below). She says one of the many fun benefits of living in Mexico is exploring the affordable high quality services available there, such as the foundry in Zapopan (outside of Guadalajara), where she was introduced to resin / polymer casting and led to her decision to cast her newest pieces in



polymer rather than bronze. She was so excited by the effect (image right) that she will return to Zapopan with several new fired clay pieces so they, too, can be molded and cast in resin. The pieces are 20-24" tall; her plan is to cast limited editions of approximately 12 of each. Although similar in form, each casting will include unique inclusions of clay-printed silk and threads in the polymer. Next she hopes to create life-size pieces. Zahava also mentions that after over 25 years of teaching and over 10 years of also teaching seniors and homeless she was asked to



write an article for **The Healing Power Art**, published this month and <u>viewable at this link</u>.







Charles Stinson has four pieces in the invitational 2018 FourSquared Alumni Exhibition at Arc Gallery, San Francisco, CA (image left, detail). The four new pieces continue the series Devices of Dubious Utility from the Museum of Post-Truth Artifacts.

Another one of the Devices is in the exhibition Forms & Sequences at the




Siskiyou Art Museum, Dunsmuir, CA, juried by **Philip Linhares**. Yet annother *Device* will be in the *littleSCULPTURE* exhibition this October at the International Sculpture Conference in Philadelphia, PA. Charles will also participate in this Fall's San Francisco Open Studios.

Stephanie Metz is known for her unique felted wool sculptures that tempt viewers to touch (image below), so she is working on multiple large-scale touchable felt sculptures to be exhibited in 2020 solo show at the de Saisset Museum in Santa Clara, CA. Stephanie has been hosting volunteer 'Felting Parties' in her studio all summer to help fabricate the pieces. Stephanie will display the works-in-progress at an Open Studio event at the Alameda Artworks,1068 The Alameda, San Jose, CA on November 3-4 from 11:00 AM - 5:00 PM. She will also participate in a Holiday Sale at the same location on Saturday, December 1st from 11:00 AM - 5:00 PM. Stephanie's studio is located through the limegreen door off the parking lot. Also, Stephanie will teach two one-day-workshops in "Beginning Sculptural Needle Felting" from her studio on October 13th and 20th, from 10:00 AM - 4:00 PM. As an eco-artist, Virginia explores some of the multi-faceted wonders of the natural world with mixed media woks including photographic images, hydrocal, acrylic paint and more. The works explore symbiotic relationships among living animals including hermit crabs and their anemones and oxpecker birds and their salon services to African wildlife. In a slightly different vein, Stearns has created a large participatory piece exploring the variety of sex and gender among humans through the lens of diverse animal sexual reproductive strategies.
